WHER hosted 37 LBQ women on Valentines day to spark conversations around violence in queer relation which culminated to having the SGBV workshop in December as part of activities to mark 16days of Activism, On lesbian visibility week WHER hosted 33 LBQ women and spoke about the importance of visibility in the work that we do. We continued our community awareness on SRHR and security tips across the country and we reached a total 1006 community members.







Advocacy

Advocacy Visits to - Nigerian Police, Federal Ministry of Health, Women Affairs, Education, National Human Rights Commission and Ministry of Justice as part of measures to drive implementation of laws such as the VAPP Law which gives little protection to everyone from violence.

WHER worked with consortium partners to repeal a section of the SSMPA



Research and Documentation

Mapping LGBTIQ Persons With Disability in 6 geopolitical zones and conducting needs assessment with LGBTIQ PWDs to understand their programmatic needs and gaps in intervention.

SRHR needs assessment for LBO women.

WHER launched information centres to ensure information for LGBTIQ persons are readily available for knowledge sharing and intention.



Safe Housing, Psychosocial Support and Emergency Funding

WHER provided 61 LBQ women with safe shelter in 2022

47 with emergency funding

112 LGBTIQ persons with psychosocial support at no cost.



Conferences and Summits

In our bid to ensure a united front and a stronger movement, WHER spearheaded African Pride Accelerated; a convergence of LGBTIQ+ community members, activists and organisations to a relaxed atmosphere to discuss issues affecting our community while unburdening our hearts from all the external push backs. This 3 day event assembled 176 community members in one auditorium, the largest gathering of LGBTIQ+ persons in Nigeria.

International Human Rights Day - In 2022 WHER gather 97 community members on the 10th of December speaking around issues about being "Vulnerable and Outside the Margins", "Resourcing the LGBTIQ+ Movement", Self Care and Wellness as a form of resilience"










As a queer muslim woman, After attending LEDI with WHER Initiative I channelled my energy into advocacy for LBQ rights. Despite facing discrimination and bias, I decided to run for a local political office. My campaign was met with resistance from some quarters, but I persevered, fueled by my belief in a more inclusive society. **Aisha**





I have always felt a deep connection to my creativity, but I struggled to express her true self as a queer woman in a conservative town like Awka. I have kept my identity a secret for years, fearing backlash from my community. Attending LGBTQ+ support groups with WHER Initiative, where I met other LBQ women who shared her experiences and made me feel more confident in my skin. - Alexandra

In a bustling and patriarchal city like Onitsha where live, as a masculine presenting woman working as a mechanic with a passion for fixing cars and motorcycles. I had faced prejudice and stereotypes in the male-dominated automotive industry but was determined to break the glass ceiling.

With support from WHER, I gathered resources and started my own auto repair shop, focusing on creating an inclusive environment where LBQ women felt comfortable bringing in their vehicles. Now I am known for my mechanical skills but also I am committed to challenging gender normsthrough my craft. - Jay

I am a feminist human rights educator, defender and activist. She is passionate and committed to the advancement of social justice including sexual and reproductive rights and gender equality, women economic empowerment and development. She is the founder and Executive Director of Women's Health and Equal Rights (WHER) Initiative, a non-profit organization focused on promoting the well-being and protecting the rights of lesbian, bisexual and queer women in Nigeria.

She serves on the Steering Committee of the Solidarity Alliance for Human Rights (SAHR), Nigeria; a coalition of organizations and individuals working to advance the rights and promote the well-being of LGBT and other sexual minorities in Nigeria. Akudo served as the Co-Chair (Female) of PAN-AFRICAN ILGA (International Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Trans and Intersex Association) from 2013 to 2018. She holds a Bachelor of Arts degree in French Language and Culture from Imo State University Owerri, Imo State Nigeria, an online certificate in grant writing and fundraising, and in Gender and Development. She holds a Master's Degree in project Management from University of Roehampton, London.

She is an EQUITAS Alumni – International human Rights Training Program. Over the years, she has garnered leadership, people and project management experience and skills working as Operations and Human Resources Officer in an ICT firm, as a Research Officer under Macro-Economic Policy and Economic Research at the Economic Community of West African States (ECOWAS) and from founding WHER in 2011 and leading the organization till date as the Executive Director.




Ugo Okolo - Communications Volunteer
